**SUBJECT: DLA Troop Support Environmental Policy Statement**

DLA Troop Support is committed to a policy of conducting business with respect and care for its people and the environment. Our policy is based on three basic concepts:


- a. Prevention of pollution at the source, whenever possible.
- b. Conservation of natural resources.
- c. Compliance with all applicable environmental laws, regulations and internal requirements.

All DLA Troop Support personnel have important roles in ensuring that these policy goals are achieved. To fulfill these commitments and responsibilities, the following guiding principles have been established:

- a. DLA Troop Support will develop, implement, and maintain an effective mission focused Environmental Management System that reflects DLA environmental policy, is consistent with the ISO 14001, International Environmental Managements System standard, and fully integrates environmental considerations into the daily operations of DLA Troop Support.
- b. DLA Troop Support will maintain and periodically verify compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local environmental laws and regulatory agreements.
- c. DLA Troop Support will develop and implement effective methods to prevent pollution, conserve resources, reduce waste, and otherwise continually improve environmental management practices.
- d. DLA Troop Support will openly communicate this policy and environmental management practices to DLA Troop Support personnel and other interested parties.
- e. DLA Troop Support will establish, periodically review, and provide funding for appropriately prioritized objectives and targets for environmental performance.

f. DLA Troop Support will continually improve environmental managements performance through training and integrating environmental considerations into the business planning process.

This environmental policy will be reviewed periodically to ensure that the commitments are consistent with DLA Troop Support's mission, operations, and resources. Commander's Personal Policy No. 4, dated November 17, 2010, is hereby superseded.
