

Subject: ALFOODACT 003-2010 Update to ALFOODACT 002-2010 Recall of Stonyfield Greek Organic "Oikos" Yogurt

Date Issued: January 12, 2010

1. REFERENCES:

2. BACKGROUND:

Heavy growth of *Bacillus cereus* was presumptively identified on initial culture samples of Stonyfield Greek Organic "Oikos" Yogurt.

3. PRODUCTION DATES/IDENTIFYING CODES:

Only Affected Products:

4 oz. Oikos Organic Greek Yogurt, Plain, UPC: 052159530501 with Date Codes 1/12/10 and 1/18/10 only

4 oz. Oikos Organic Greek Yogurt, Vanilla, UPC: 052159530518 with Date Codes 1/12/10 and 1/18/10 only

All other Stonyfield Oikos Organic Greek Yogurt products are NOT affected by this alert and should be removed from medical hold status.

5. DISTRIBUTION: Nationwide. Known to be in DeCA facilities.

6. REASON FOR ACTION: Potentially contaminated with *Bacillus cereus*.

7. INSTRUCTIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR MESSAGE RECIPIENTS:

a. Immediately inventory stocks to identify the above items and secure in a "Medical Hold" status to provide assurance of no further issue/sale/use. POSITIVE FINDINGS should be reported to Accountable Officers/Vendor Representatives of that facility. Accountable Officer/Agency representatives/Buyers/Contracting Officers should seek refund/credit/replacement through the normal distribution channel with which the product was received (i.e. Distribution Centers, Prime Vendors, Manufacturers).

b. Ships at sea are authorized to destroy or dispose of recalled products at their discretion. Documentation for the number of pounds and cases, and any additional pertinent information must be signed by the Accountable Officer and is required for the purpose of recouping to the government

the cost of the product involved. In order to get credit please use a SF 364 and forward to your supporting FISC and copy furnished to NAVSUP 51. Your supporting FISC should forward to the account manager at DSCP. The form should include the number of the recall authorizing the survey action. Home ported ships/galleys will utilize DD form 1149 to transfer w/ reimbursement to the PV. The PV will submit credit invoice to the account manager at DSCP.

c. Except for Prime Vendors, POSITIVE and NEGATIVE RESPONSES directly to the DSCP Consumer Safety Officer (CSO) ARE NOT required. Prime Vendors should report findings to their DSCP Contracting Officer with a courtesy copy to the Consumer Safety Officer (dscpconssafofc@dla.mil). Other agencies such as DeCA, AAFES, MWR, VA, MCCA, etc. should report POSITIVE and NEGATIVE responses in accordance with their agency recall policies.
